# SCIENCE IN RICHMOND CLASS

Here Richmond class are during science. They created a mixture of fake stomach bile using bread, coffee grounds and water and passed it through a pair of tights (large intestines) to see how the digestive system works!





## SCIENCE IN OLYMPIC



This half term Olympic class have been exploring the properties of materials – which materails are hard, flexible, magnetic, translucent and so on. As part of this the class have explored mixtures and separating them (we had a fun lesson dissolving salt in water and then boiling the water away to sesparate the salt again) and baked cakes to show the difference between a mixture and a compound.











# MATHS AT BRICK LANE SCHOOL



In maths we have been focussing on the four main arithmetic operations – addition, subtraction, multiplication and division – and in particular noticing that while the order of the numbers in a calcualtion makes no difference in addition and multiplication, it makes a big difference in subtraction and division. At the end of term we have started talking about shapes and their properties, including angles – and made some Christmas decorations out of shapes!

We have also completed decorating the "million cube" shown in the last newsletter. As well has having a specific maths purpose, it is covered in a wealth of information from maths and beyond, including clocks, shops, prepositions, punctuation and the zones of emotional regulation. With contributions from nearly every student, it really is a "whole school" project!



## HYDE CLASS UPDATE



Hyde are settling in nicely with our new form teacher Mr Smith and the class have been participating well in lessons.

Some have made us laugh and one even made a few of the class sick - sorry again for that.

We have been working on social interaction and how to get along with people in different scenarios.

We also had great fun on our outing to a local art gallery which gave us lots of inspiration for making art for our own gallery in school.



## **ENGLISH AT BRICK LANE**



**Brick Lane Wizards Rocket Though Longest Term!** 

The second autumn term is always going to be tough; shorter days, colder weather, 226 days until the summer holidays...

However, the students at Brick Lane School have done brilliantly, taking on each challenge and always trying their best!

Olympic class have been looking at myths and legends from all over the world, from the Loch Ness monster to the lost city of El Dorado. We've covered Robin Hood, Amazon warriors, as well as developing our core reading and writing skills.

Both Hyde and Richmond class have been reading the spooky tale "The Curse of Cogston House". In Hyde class, we went on to create our own adventure, discovering the "Curse of Brick Lane" in a Dungeons and Dragons style adventure. In Richmond class, we looked at how we can create atmosphere in our stories, creating a sound scape to go along with the reading. And as always, our "Fun with Phonics" lessons have helped students solve spelling and grammar problems through different games.

## **GREENWICH CLASS**

Hello from Greenwich Class! As we bid farewell to another half term, we are eager to share the experiences our pupils have encountered this time around. This was a half-term full of knowledge and fun and our Greenwich superheroes did amazing.

In Mathematics, the focus has been on multiplication tables with pupils demonstrating enthusiasm and determination to learn them and use them! We will continue with this topic for a while next half term; but I can tell you they are learning them fast!

English this half term has been great for discovering important events around us. Pupils engaged in daily reading sessions, practicing their Spelling, Punctuation, and Grammar, and exploring writing composition skills. This exploration included learning about festivals and significant cultural dates.

## **GREENWICH CLASS**



In Science, pupils investigated animals by types and diets. They learnt about the features of mammals, birds, reptiles, and amphibians. They also distinguished between herbivores, carnivores, and omnivores. In a very fun lesson, we started to learn about the digestive system and pupils could not believe what happened to their nice food at the end of the digestion process!

History lessons transported us back in time to explore the lives, homes, and boats of the Vikings and compared them to Anglo-Saxons. The topic served as a great platform for interesting questions and class discussions. We completed their learning through map skills in Geography. We guided our pupils in using maps to locate various regions of the UK and Scandinavia, marking an introduction to the use of atlases. They started sketching simple maps with keys and directions. This learning ended with the exploration of coordinates and simple compass points by mapping the North Pole!

We particularly enjoyed PHSE this half-term, as we delve into the understanding of friendships and explored interests linked to potential career and jobs.

We also had some great reward moments as the pupils achieved another checkpoint in their Dojo Reward table, we had planned a picnic in the park, but the weather did not allow us to do so. It was wet and muddy, so the pupils voted for an indoor picnic and film afternoon. We watched Element and munch on the children's chosen foods.

## **CLINICAL TEAM**



During the Autumn 2023, the Clinical Team has continued to embed themselves into Brick Lane School to support pupils and teachers on a specialist level (1:1 therapy sessions), enhanced level (specialised training for classes) and universal level (whole school strategies and training).

Alexandra has worked hard developing resources and providing trainings for language, communication, emotional and social development. This has included: Size of The Problem, Inner Coach vs Inner Critic, Behavioural Mapping, Social Detective, Language for Thinking, Colourful Semantics, and Intensive Interaction. She has supported staff with writing Annual Review Targets and meeting the needs outlined in Education and Health Care Plans (EHCPs).

Shika has focused on developing systems and supporting staff to align with Ask, Accept and Develop (AAD), our neurodiverse-affirming strategy. She has worked closely with liaising with external agencies (e.g., CAMHS, GOSH) to embed relevant support into the school and 1:1 sessions with pupils, were deemed appropriate.

In January 2024, we are excited to be collaborating with Barnado's. Ms
Tenisha Frame will be joining Brick Lane School for one day a week to
support pupils with their emotional wellbeing.


In addition, we will have a locum Occupational Therapist, Georgia joining us for one day a week for the first half term. She will be continuing with the input provided by Laura O'Donnell Donohoe this term in supporting pupils with their physical, sensory, emotional, and daily living needs.

The Clinical Team is excited to continue strengthening the working relationship with parents and teachers. 2024 will bring more coffee mornings, parent workshops, and parent-teacher-clinical meetings.


